

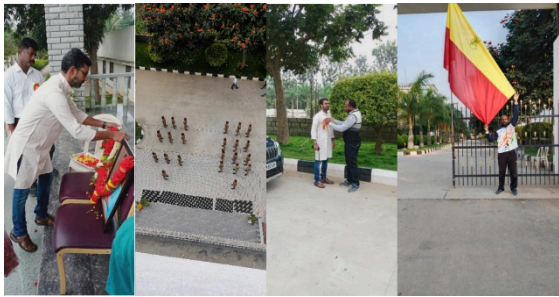
Kannada Rajyotsava Celebration – 2022
